

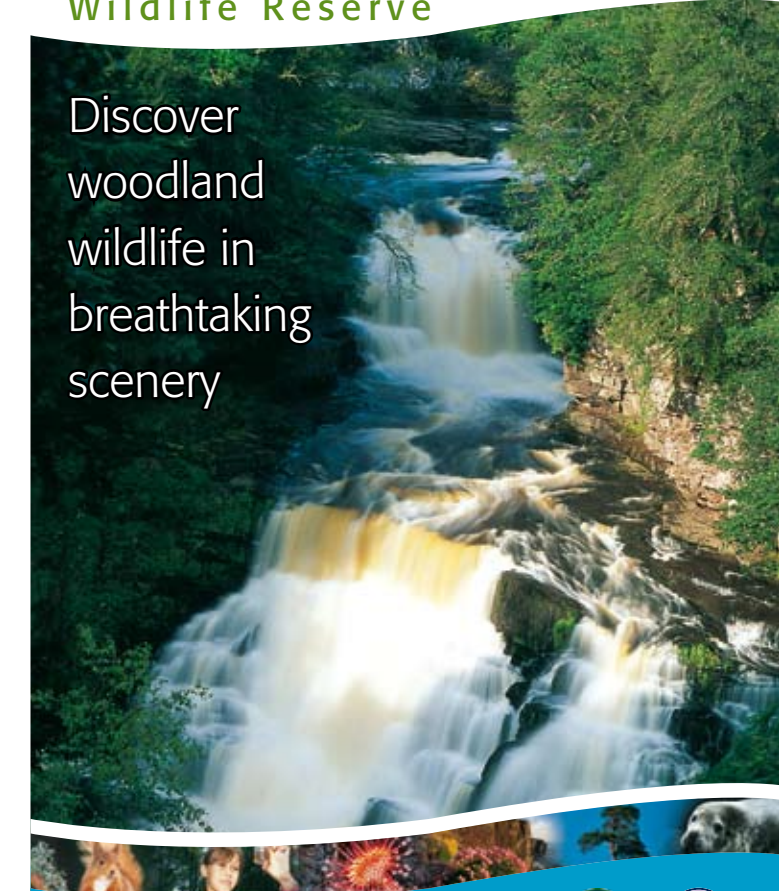

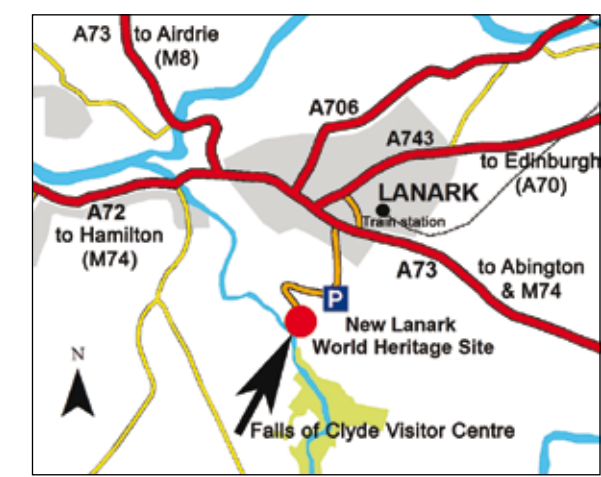

By car

One mile (1.6 km) south of Lanark, off the A73. Follow signs for New Lanark Heritage Site. SWT visitor centre is in the Old Mill Dyeworks in New Lanark, past Robert Owen School.

By train and bus

Train and bus stations located in Lanark. Hourly service from Lanark.

Special provision

The visitor centre is wheelchair friendly including toilet facilities. An induction loop is fitted.

Guided walks and wildlife watches are available from £4.00. Booking essential.

Education activities are available for school groups. Ask at the visitor centre for more information.

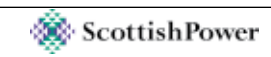

Stimulate your senses in our exciting visitor centre with interactive displays that provide an insight into the features and creatures on the reserve.

Discover the best spots to see wildlife on the reserve. Look out for kingfishers, otters, butterflies and deer.

Explore woodland wonders without leaving the comfort of the visitor centre with our "sniff-and-feel" boxes.

Experience life as a badger and find out more about night time adventures using our investigation tables. CCTV footage gives a glimpse into their nocturnal nature.

Get to grips with bat basics and learn about these fascinating creatures with our unique bat booth.

Watch live CCTV footage in the visitor centre. See wildlife and the magnificent waterfalls.



Be safe!

Stick to paths and be aware of sudden water changes in the river due to the hydroelectric powerstation.

Remember these walks can be muddy particularly in winter so please take appropriate footwear. Binoculars are also recommended.

Ask at the visitor centre for up-to-date news on access to the reserve.

On the reserve

Follow one of the walks through breathtaking scenery and marvel at the three spectacular waterfalls. See the power of the river as it plunges downstream.

Spot historical features along the way. Keep your eyes peeled for the remains of Bonnington Iron Bridge, Viewing Pavillion (Hall of Mirrors) and the fifteenth century Corra Castle.

Smell the wildflowers along our river edge boardwalk and watch butterflies flutter in the meadow.



See the peregrine in flight. Reaching speeds of up to 200 mph, these creatures are the fastest on earth – and you can see them on the reserve!
