Planning review/monitoring/commenting/objecting issues had been discussed as well as major concerns expressed in relation to monitoring/reviewing forestry applications. Forestry applications were expected to rapidly increase in relation to meeting SG's climate change tree planting targets. CBG's area would be the subject of a substantial proportion of these planting plans.
