Message from Alison Irvine, Chair



As the days lengthen my thoughts turn to spring – what will I grow in the garden, what seeds will I plant, and what sort of a year will it be for our wildlife? My nest boxes

are all cleaned out and a few new ones erected for the resident tits, sparrows (both house and tree) and starlings.

At our AGM last November I was very keen to make the links between what we do locally, both as a members group and as individuals, and the SWT national vision. We were lucky to have Jo Pike, Director of Public Affairs in attendance. She talked us through the new 5 year plan for SWT. Would You Like to be a Reserves Convenor ?

Amongst the many valued groups of volunteers within the group are the reserves convenors. These are the people who keep an eye on our reserves and report any issues back to the East Central Scotland Reserves Manager at SWT HQ.

Ideally a convenor needs to live locally and to be able visit the reserve several times a year. Some convenors concentrate on recording different groups of wildlife, some on undertaking active management within the reserve plan and others on involving local communities with the reserve plan.

At present we have a vacancy for a reserves convenor at Cullaloe, our reserve near Aberdour. This has a good mix of habitats from open water through dense willow scrub to mature trees with lots of scope for recording and for ecological, social, moral and economic reasons to protect and restore nature; **Demonstrating** best practice in practical conservation and the creation of Living Landscapes and Living Seas; **Inspiring** people to experience and learn about and care for wildlife and wild places.

Sometimes it may feel as if the lofty ambitions of the Trust are disconnected from our day to day experiences of wildlife conservation. However, it is very important to appreciate that everything we do locally adds up to achieving lots across Scotland as a whole. So whether you feed the birds, decide to develop a wildlife friendly area of garden or an insect friendly planter of flowers; or whether you decide to learn more about Fife and Kinross wildlife by coming on a walk or attending a talk, I hope you appreciate that all you do to support SWT is important both locally and nationally.

As usual we have a good programme of walks through out the year and I hope to meet many of you at these.

Corn Bunting 2018 Appeal

Thanks to the cooperation of farmers in Fife, Corn Bunting territories in Fife increased by 26% in 2017, which followed an 18% increase in 2016. The scheme started with 5 farms in 2003 and now there are over 20. However as a result of this success more volunteers are required to monitor the farmland bird populations on the participating estates.







In 2017 the secretary, Paul Blackburn, surveyed Balcarres Estate, West of Elie and greatly enjoyed the experience with good numbers of the target species of Corn Bunting, Skylark and Reed Bunting plus close encounters with other wildlife such as Roe Deer and Brown Hare.
