
## Montrose Basin Visitor Centre

## Loch of the Lowes Visitor Centre



#### By car

If using sat nav, use the postcode PH8 0ES. Follow the signposts from the A9. The reserve is located 1.8 miles north east of Dunkeld, just off the A923 Blairgowrie road. Free car parking is available at the visitor centre.

The nearest railway station is Dunkeld & Birnam. There are also bus stops in Dunkeld and in Birnam.

The visitor centre is wheelchair friendly, including toilet facilities. An induction loop is fitted. Education activities are available for school groups. Ask at the visitor centre for more information. Guide dogs only in the visitor centre and viewing hides. On the woodland trail, dogs are welcome under strict control and on leads.

#### Summer

Spring

Witness the daily lives of our ospreys close up via our high definition camera and from our viewing hides. Watch them fishing on the loch.



#### Autumn

Watch red squirrels from only a couple of feet away as they gather hazelnuts to bury, in readiness for the colder months ahead.



Wildfowl gathering in large numbers on the loch can easily be seen from our viewing hides using our telescopes and binoculars.
