Residential Species Protection Officer (Volunteer)

Location

Loch of the Lowes reserve, Dunkeld, Perthshire

How many volunteers are needed?

2

How many hours per day/per week are you needed?

Mid March to early June – rotational shift rota to provide a 24-hour protection. This could involve unsociable hours shifts and could include weekends. Much will depend on the timing of the breeding season.

On which days are you needed?

You will be needed for 5 out of 7 days per week.

On which date do we want you to start?

Late March 2020

End Date (if applicable)

Early June depending on the breeding season.

Minimum commitment we require from you.

5 days per week. We aim to keep hours below 35 per week.

Objectives of your role

Osprey Species Protection

Working on a rota system you will be responsible for carrying out the surveillance of the osprey nest and surrounding area, including monitoring the osprey behaviour for incidents of disturbance.

Occasionally you may be required to approach members of the public in event of potential or suspected disturbance and point out the law regarding Schedule One breeding birds. This may require further liaising with the Wildlife Crime Officer.

Each day will see you working in a cooperative manner with the Perthshire Ranger, Visitor Centre staff and daily local volunteers. There may be opportunity to engage with members of the public who are visiting the hides about the ospreys and the other wildlife on the reserve.

Further duties include monitoring the beaver population around the reserve, mainly by reviewing camera footage, contributing to regular social media and blog posts and the opportunity exits to get involved in delivering weekly public 'Beaverwatch' events.

Tasks

- Monitoring and surveying the site for any potential osprey disturbance
- Investigating and approaching members of the public regarding any incidents of potential disturbance
- Observing and recording osprey behaviour
- Engaging with members of the public in hides and liaising with daily local volunteers and visitor's centre staff, particularly during dayshifts
- Monitoring the beaver populations around the reserve by reviewing camera footage
- Contributing to regular blogs, social media content
- Presenting weekly 'Beaverwatch' evenings
- Helping to produce an end of season Osprey Report

Description of the skills/qualifications/fitness required

- Ability and experience of living in a residential setting as part of a small team
- Able to work unsociable hours in our on-site hides, including occasional nightshifts
- Ability to work in a flexible manner
- Ability to engage & communicate positively with local volunteers and members of the public
- Basic computer literacy skills, including the use of spreadsheets
- Good observational skills and attention to detail
- Good organisational and time keeping skills
- Reasonable standard of fitness
- Experience of public speaking and video editing beneficial
- Own transport and first aid qualification an advantage

Support/training

All support will be provided by our in-house staff and will include:

- Osprey species ecology training
- Gain experience in species protection
- Gain experience in visitor engagement and delivering events
- Gain experience in video editing and social media blogging
- Optics and staff uniform provided
- On-site accommodation in an eco-bothy
