Objective(s) of your volunteer role

Saving Scotland's Red Squirrels are working to deliver red squirrel conservation South Scotland. We want to prevent the invasive non-native grey squirrel from replacing red squirrels in South Scotland and reduce occurrences of squirrel pox transmission from grey to red squirrel populations. Grey squirrel control is delivered by a combination of project staff, landowners funded via the Forestry Grant Scheme, and volunteers all trapping grey squirrels in carefully chosen project areas. You'll be an ambassador for the project, providing grey control support to the Annandale Red Squirrel Group, Project Officer and partner organisations to deliver the project's aims in the Annandale area.

Tasks

Support volunteers on the trap loan scheme, by:

- · Carrying out humane dispatch of grey squirrels.
- · Liaising with local trap hosts.
- Re-setting and baiting traps.
- · Record keeping.
